### **Trail Restoration at Audubon Canyon Ranch Bouverie Preserve: Glen Ellen, CA**

Join Summer Search student leaders, Bouverie Preserve and Santa Rosa REI for a day of trail maintenance and improvement. Together we will ready the trails for the winter rains. Tasks will vary from easy to moderately strenuous and include re-grading the trails, removing berms and installing rolling grade dips. These trail improvements will help prevent hillside erosion and soil sediment from getting into our streams, which will help keep the preserve healthy and flourishing for all to learn from and enjoy. Tools will be provided. Volunteers should wear sturdy shoes, and bring water and lunch, and gloves if they have them.

**Beautify grounds at Sonoma Valley High School: Sonoma, CA** Join Summer Search and the Volunteer Center of Sonoma County to beautify the grounds at Sonoma Valley High School. Pull weeds, rake leaves and remove litter while saving the school hours and dollars in staff time. Volunteers should bring water and wear sturdy shoes and comfortable clothes they don't mind getting dirty.

### **Build Altars for Dia De Los Muertos at La Luz Center: Sonoma, CA**

Join Summer Search and La Luz Center, a family resource center, to build altars for an upcoming Dia De los Muertos Celebration. Employ your crafty and artistic skills to paint and make flowers to enrich the festive celebration that will unify community in November. Volunteers should bring water and wear comfortable clothes they don't mind getting dirty.

**Plant garden at Larson Park with Nuestra Voz: Agua Caliente, CA** Join Summer Search and Nuestra Voz, a grassroots leadership development program, to assemble raised garden beds, plant vegetables and lay mulch to create a rich community garden accessible to the entire Agua Caliente community. Volunteers should bring water and wear sturdy shoes and comfortable clothes they don't mind getting dirty.
